

# Your Campus Tour

**4 City Campus East (CCE)**

Camden Courts self catered living accommodation built in 2002 and has 345 rooms. All rooms are en-suite with 4-6 students sharing a kitchen and dining room in self contained flats. Costs are from £99.95 - £132.55 per week including fuel costs\*

The award-winning buildings are eco friendly having recycled 95% of the waste materials from the cinema which previously occupied the site. Rain water is also collected from the roofs and reused to flush toilets. The design of the two buildings is in the shape of the brain, with the creative side (School of Design) on the left and the thinking side (Newcastle Business School and Northumbria Law School) on the right. Northumbria Law School has its own dedicated law library and law court. The courtroom has also been used by a host of TV programmes over the years as an authentic setting for filming courtroom scenes. Famous Alumni from the Business School include Bob Murray CBE (former Chairman of Sunderland Association Football Club), Toby Flood (England rugby star), and Margaret Fay OBE (former Managing Director and General Manager of Tyne Tees Television).



**2 The Wynne Jones Centre**

Leaving through the main entrance, directly ahead of you is:

The Wynne Jones Centre houses facilities for the schools of Built and Natural Environment and the Graduate School.

Students who want to start their own business can use The Hatchery where they can hire office space. On the fourth floor is the Multifaith Chaplaincy. The Chaplain offers pastoral and spiritual support to students and staff of all faiths.

Next to the Wynne Jones Centre is Nixon Hall which is one of the largest lecture theatres on city campus holding up to 224 students.

## About Coach Lane

Having no fewer than 8,000 full and part-time students, we are the largest School in Northumbria University. All students at Coach Lane Campus are studying a Health, Education or Community related course.

As well as the library at City Campus, there is a library located on Coach Lane Campus East which provides a comprehensive range of services to support students and staff with their studies.

Coach Lane Campus also has its own Students' Union which is run by students, for students. Everyone who enrolls at Northumbria automatically becomes a member and can enjoy all the benefits that the Union offers. Food and drinks are available from here, and there is a Costa and a canteen as well as the Union, which serves food daily.

The Clinical Skills Centre at Coach Lane is a mock hospital, giving students who study nursing, midwifery, occupational therapy, operating department practice and physiotherapy the chance to gain practical skills and give a real insight to their chosen area of study. Many students at Coach Lane are given the chance to spend a lot of time on placement, again giving them the chance to have a real 'hands on' approach whilst on their course.

Unlike City Campus, Coach Lane has intakes in January and March as well as September, so there is always a lively and friendly atmosphere here.

# City Campus Tour Guide

Famous alumni from the School of Design include Jonathan Ive who designed the iMac and iPod, and Scott Henshall, an international fashion designer.

*Walk back over the bridge and turn right, this will lead you towards the Sports Centre. On your way if you look right, over the dual carriageway you will see:*

### 5 Pandon Building

Home to the School of Computing, Engineering and Information Sciences, this building has recently been renovated and is now equipped with the latest IT facilities. Pandon Open Access area gives students 24hr access to IT facilities including around 150 PCs (entry is by University Smartcard only).

*Continuing along the path, on your left hand side you will see Sport Central:*

### 6 Sport Central



Sport Central is the university's new £30 million sports facility. Open to students, staff and members of the public, Sport Central has a 3000

seat indoor arena which offers a player and spectator experience second to none. In addition to hosting university games, the arena is also home to the British Basketball Champions, the Newcastle Eagles. Sport Central offers 4 sport halls, a 25 metre swimming pool with variable depth floor, a 12 metre climbing wall with eighteen different climbing routes, a 40 metre sprint track, 3 glass backed squash courts, a strength and conditioning suite and a fitness centre with over 150 stations of cardiovascular, resistance, core-stability and free weights. Incorporated within Sport Central are a number of world class laboratories dedicated to research at the cutting edge of sport science. These laboratories will be utilised for academic excellence and study but will also be used to improve the performance of our own university athletes on the performance sport programme.

*Walking up the path and looking to your right you will see:*

### 7 Lovaine Hall

There is a mix of fully catered rooms and self catered rooms in this 156 room student accommodation.

Costs range from £73.50 for self catered rooms to £95.50 for catered rooms. All rooms include fuel, possessions insurance and internet access

*Directly ahead is:*

### 8 Claude Gibb Hall

Fully catered halls with 261 rooms. Students share washing and toilet facilities.

Costs are approximately £106.40 per week and include breakfast and evening meal, lunch is served at weekends.

*Opposite Claude Gibb Hall and across the zebra crossing is:*



### 9 Squires Building

This building is home to the School of Arts and Social Sciences. The school has a diverse and dynamic portfolio of subjects including; Performing Arts, Journalism, History, Fine Art and Modern Foreign Languages.

The Reception area is on the ground floor along side the Gallery North entrance. Specialist rooms in this building include woodwork and metal shops, sculpture rooms and art studios. Avis suites and radio broadcasting rooms are also available.

*Directly behind Squires is:*

### 10 Lipman Building

Lipman Building is primarily used for the teaching of Arts and Social Sciences. The ground floor houses a large lecture theatre and café.

Located in the basement there is a 103 seat theatre used by students from the performance courses as well as technical theatre support room.

*Turning left after the zebra crossing you will come to:*

### The Quad

The Quad is the heart of the City Campus, here you will find the Students' Union, the Library and Student Services.

### 11 The Students' Union



The Students' Union is the social hub of the campus. Run by a team of student officers known as the Executive Committee, the Students' Union not only organises hundreds of fun activities and

events but also provides independent advice and great volunteer opportunities to enhance your CV.

Having just undergone major refurbishment, the Students' Union now boasts a range of bars, a new theatre and live music venue, food and retail outlets, plenty of recreational space and IT facilities.

*The tall brown brick building in the Quad is:*

### 12 The Library

The library has almost 500,000 books, journals, periodicals and dissertations and over 380 workstations spread over 9 floors.



In the basement there is The Leaning Café, ideal for group study. On the first floor there is an IT suite, complete with black and white and colour printers, laptop hire, research hubs and classrooms available to hire.

Help is available 24 hours a day through our ask4help service – in person, by telephone or via email.

Adjacent to the library is Gallery North, a contemporary and dynamic exhibition space with vision and great potential. Admission is free and art workshops are also available.

*If you walk through the walkway beneath the Student Services sign you will come to:*

### 13 Northumberland Building

This is home to the School of Psychology and Sports Sciences. The school houses CoCo, a world renowned research centre, the Brain, Performance and Nutrition Centre and a number of psychology labs.

Famous alumni include Gold medal Women's cycling Individual Sprint event winner Victoria Pendleton and Jamie Noon, England rugby player.

Northumberland Building also houses Student Services. This department provides advice and support to students across a range of areas including; welfare, finance, careers, counselling, international issues, mental health and disability support.

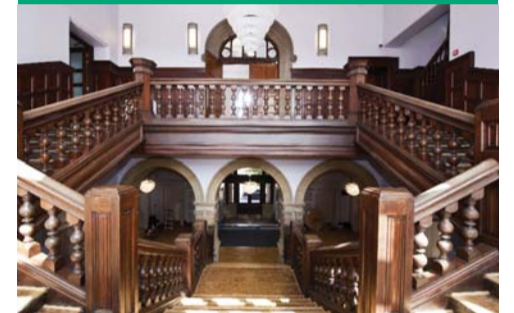
*You should come out onto Northumberland Road, to the right is:*

### 14 Trinity Building

A converted church, the building is now used for IT facilities for Built and Natural Environment students as well as being the home of the Marketing and Recruitment department and Northumbria Graphics.

### 15 Sutherland Building

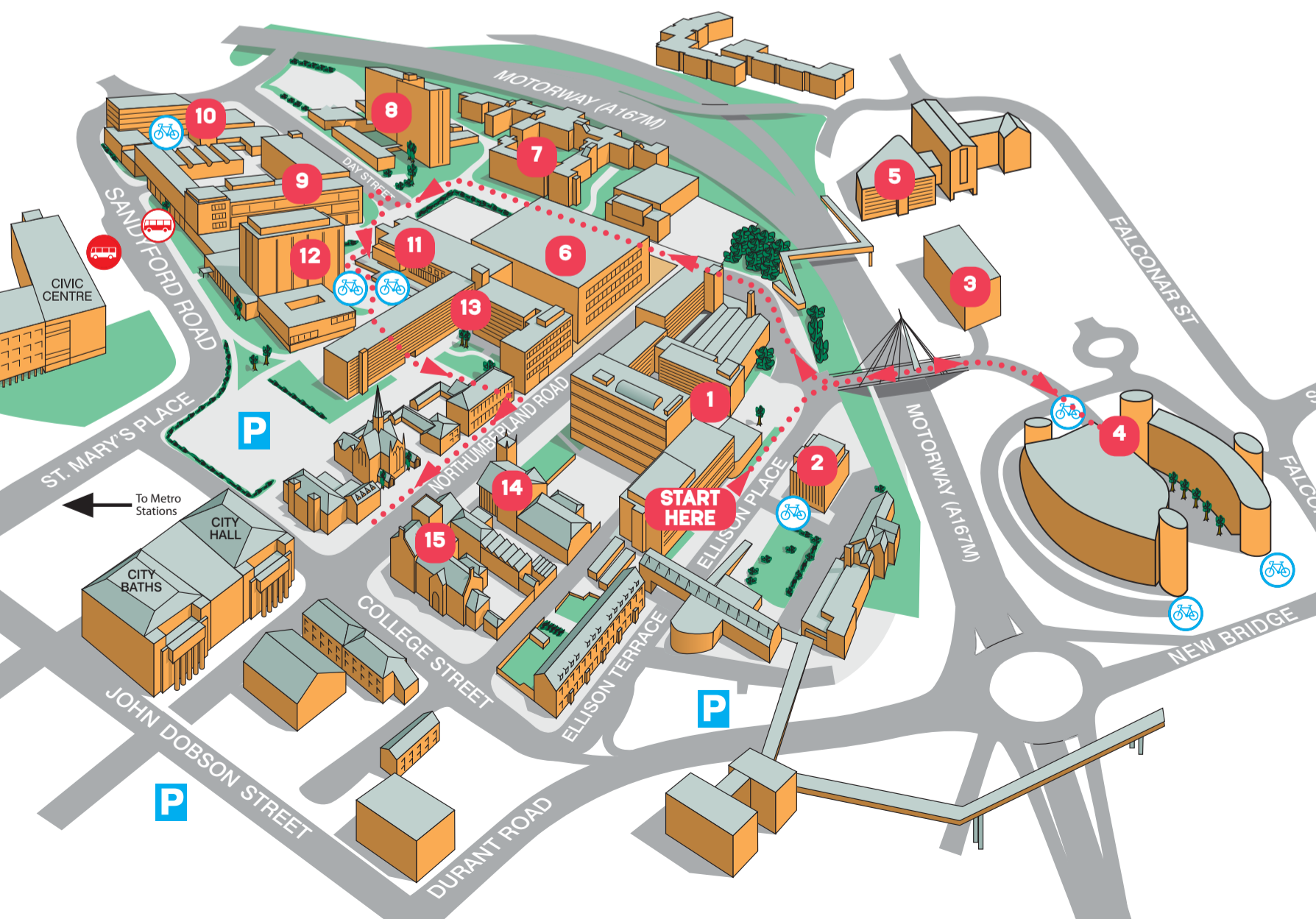


The University's Finance Office and Human Resources Department are situated here.
