Location

Northumbria University city campus is located 5 minutes from the centre of Newcastle upon Tyne. Newcastle is in the North East of England and has an international airport with regular flights direct to Barcelona, Malaga, Murcia, Ibiza, Palma, Mahon, Girona and Reus.













Undergraduate applicants should apply via UCAS where possible. Postgraduate applicants can apply direct online. Search for your chosen course at northumbria.ac.uk/study and click'Apply Now'.

For most courses, we recommend submitting your application before 1 July (for September entry) however some courses do have earlier deadlines so check course pages for details.

Study Abroad

If you're not sure about studying a full degree in the UK, you can experience Northumbria for a semester or one academic year through our Study Abroad programme, or for three weeks at our International Summer School. Both options are open to undergraduate students from any university and you'll qualify for 20% alumni discount on any postgraduate course if you return to Northumbria for your Masters degree.

The Study Abroad tuition fee is £5,000 per semester and Summer School is £2,500 including accommodation.

Fees and financial support

Spanish students pay the same tuition fee as UK students. For academic year 2016/17, the undergraduate fee is £9,000 per year and the standard postgraduate fee is £5,450 per year.

Undergraduate students may apply for a loan from the UK Government to cover the full cost of their tuition fees, which does not need to be paid back until the student is earning over £21,000.
