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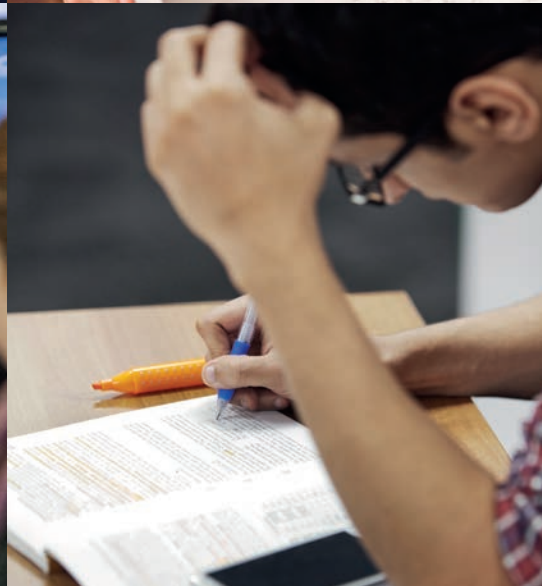

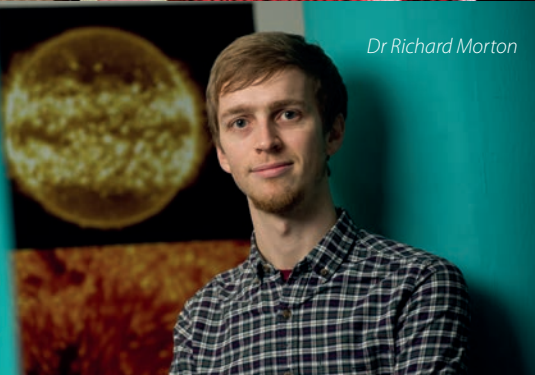

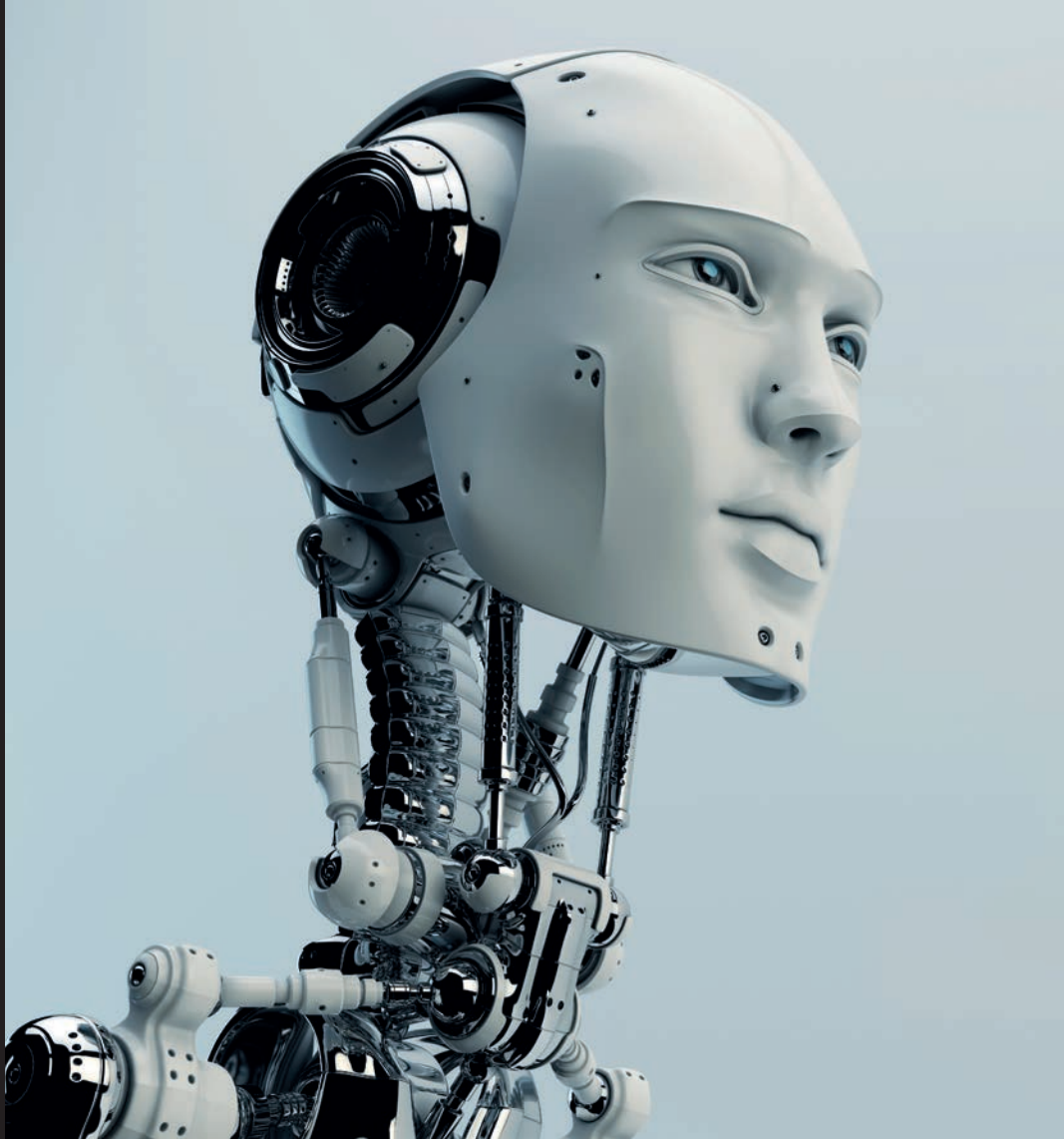

Leading the debate

If you want to be part of a university that is internationally recognised for creating successful, multidisciplinary partnerships that deliver impactful world-class research, Northumbria University is the right choice for you.

Our track record and recent REF results mean that we are in a stronger position than ever to lead the debate and respond to today's challenges. If you want to work with us to shape tomorrow's solutions, here are some of the fundamental questions that we will be addressing in our research:

Can bio-based products and processes save the planet while driving our economy?

As we continue to plunder the Earth's scarce resources, it is clear that we need to extend the range of alternative solutions to the way we currently live. Northumbria's Bioeconomy research explores a wide range of solutions such as how to replace toxic methods of chemical production with 'green chemistry', how to capture carbon within bioeconomic systems, how to improve food quality through biorefineries, and how to develop novel beneficial health interventions. We place particular emphasis on technological applications of high throughput genomics, metabolomics and proteomics techniques.

Our research not only attracts significant grants from Research Councils UK but also from industrial partners. We have undertaken research and innovation projects for Unilever, Nestlé, Mondelez, GlaxoSmithKline, Merck, Prozomix, Chemoxy and other companies in the food, biotech, pharmaceutical and consumer goods industries. This research encompasses the disciplines of Chemistry, Environmental Sciences, Food and Nutritional Sciences and Biomedical Sciences.

How will lives be transformed in the next 20 years because of changes in digital technologies?

Artificial intelligence, cyber security and big data: these are developments that open up intriguing and troubling possibilities for how we live and how our cities operate. Northumbria has an international reputation in specific areas within these developments, including data fusion, privacy, digital economy and business, and digitally-enabled communities. Our researchers in digital living have attracted millions of pounds of funding over the last five years from sources that include Research Councils UK, the EU, Qatar Science Foundation and InnovateUK.

Northumbria University is on track to become one of the leading centres of knowledge about secure digital cities and the intersection of people, technology and place. Our staff are collaborators with the Digital Economy Research Centre, the Future Cities Lab 2 and the ANDROID Disaster Resilience Network, among many more. This research brings together the disciplines of Architecture and Built Environment, Computer Science, Geography, Mathematics and Information Sciences, Newcastle Business School and Psychology.

What lessons can humans learn from extreme environments where conditions challenge the existence of most known life forms?

Survival in extreme environments requires extraordinary adaptations. Northumbria is recognised for ground-breaking research into such adaptations, including our work in cold and palaeo environments extending from exploration of Antarctic subglacial lakes and climatic reconstruction using deep ocean cores, to carbon release from Siberian permafrost. In addition our experts in solar physics are taking part in an international project to build the world's biggest and most revolutionary solar telescope. Our researchers have attracted funding from sources such as Research Councils UK, the EU, the Leverhulme Trust and the US Air Force.

Our work spans the disciplines of Geography, Astrophysics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Physics, Applied Sciences and Statistics. The University's multidisciplinary approach allows us to tackle complex problems that defy easy classification but which are increasingly urgent in the modern world. Our research works towards harnessing and furthering our understanding of physical and biological environments that operate under extreme conditions.

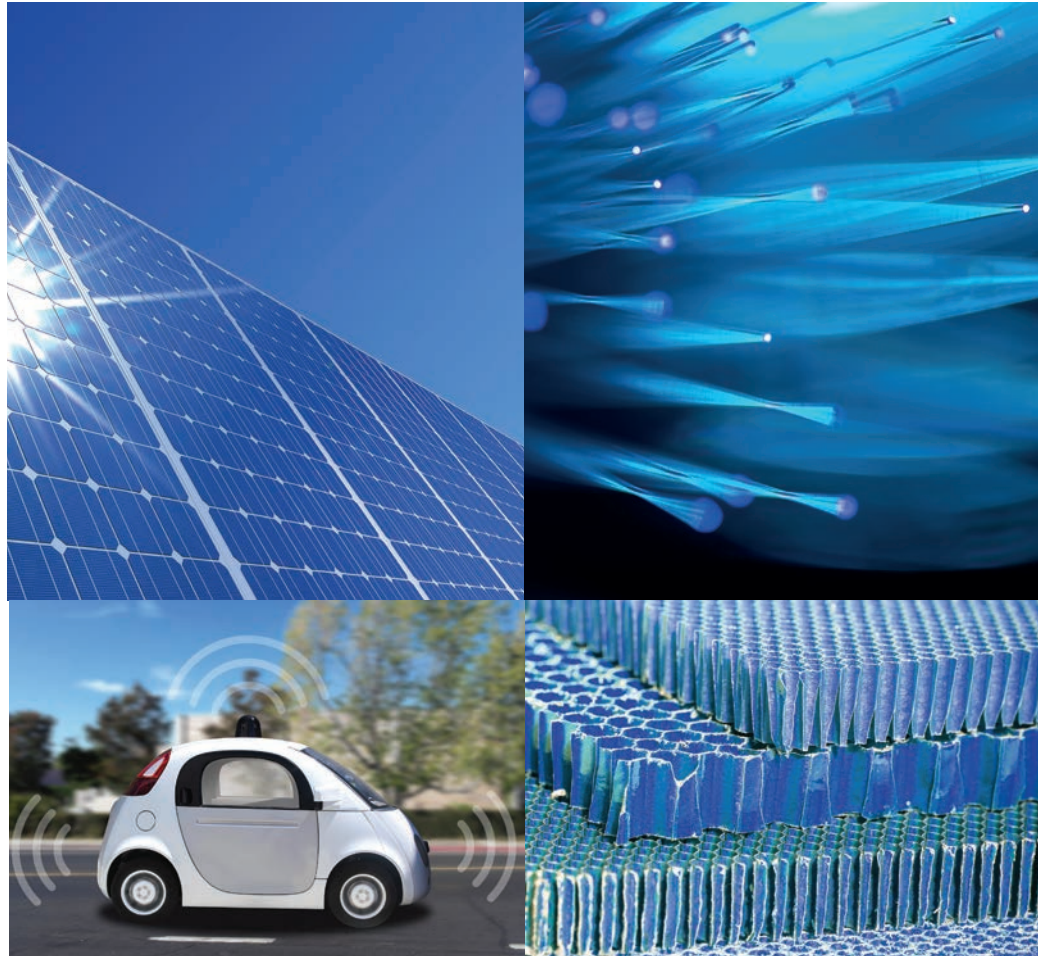


How can engineers make the physical aspects of cities more efficient so that they can cope with more people yet fewer resources?

We already have an international reputation in the areas of intelligent transport systems, smart materials and surfaces, photonic communications and renewable energy and power. We also have one of the world's leading research groups on visible light communications and free space optics. Our whole systems approach means that the best innovations in each area can be combined into novel and exciting ways to deliver the engineering of the future.

What makes humans tick? What drives us in terms of culture, creativity, impulses and many other human facets?

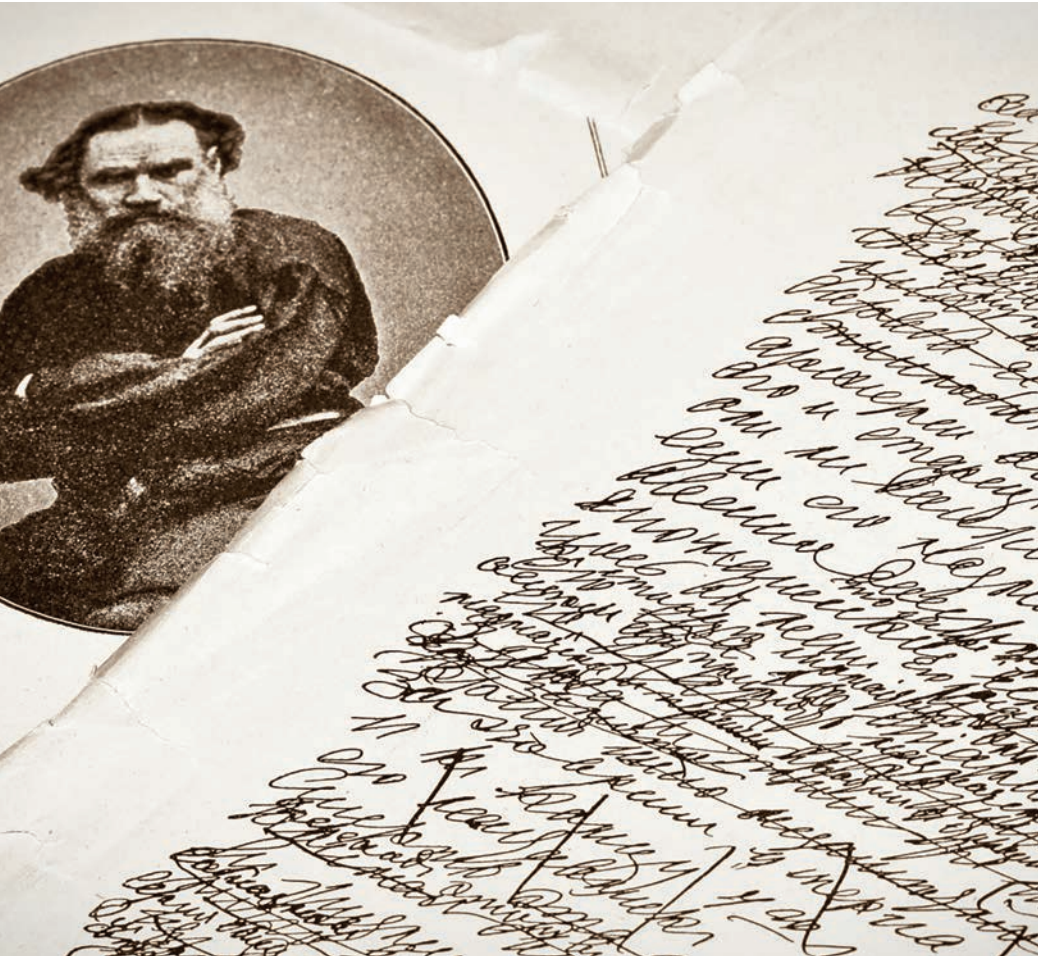
The Institute of Humanities at Northumbria University is committed to studying the human experience across time. Our critical scholarship aims to disrupt accepted paradigms and address societal challenges through a deep awareness of the human condition.

We are recognised for world-leading research in several Humanities' disciplines. Results from the 2014 Research Excellence Framework showed that, for both English and History, Northumbria University is ranked in the top quartile of UK universities. Our researchers have attracted major funding from Research Councils UK as well as the British Academy, Leverhulme Trust and Nuffield Foundation.

Our current work focuses on five strategic areas: Memory, Heritage and Identity; Transnationalism and Societal Change; Digital Humanities; Medical/Health Humanities; American Studies.

This research brings together the disciplines of Art History, American Studies, Creative Writing, English Language and Linguistics, English Literature, History, Media Studies.

What are the most effective ways to have an impact on today's health and social care challenges?

In recent years Northumbria University has attracted over £15 million of research grants to explore different aspects of this question. Our main areas of research activity are: Creative Health Interventions and Wellbeing Technologies in Context; Schools and Vulnerable Populations; Family and Social Justice; The Role of Physical Activity and Diet in the Management of Chronic Disease Burden.

There is an unprecedented demographic change underway, as the proportion of young people declines while that of older people and the incidence of chronic medical conditions are increasing.

Through our research we have built up a wide variety of partnerships, collaborations and connections with organisations such as the NHS, Public Health England, the Care Quality Commission, the British Medical Association, the Family Justice Board and many others.

This research brings together the disciplines of Psychology, Education and Lifelong Learning, Healthcare, Social Work and Communities, Public Health and Wellbeing, Sport, Exercise and Rehabilitation, Applied Sciences, Maths and Information Sciences, Law, Design, Social Sciences and Languages.

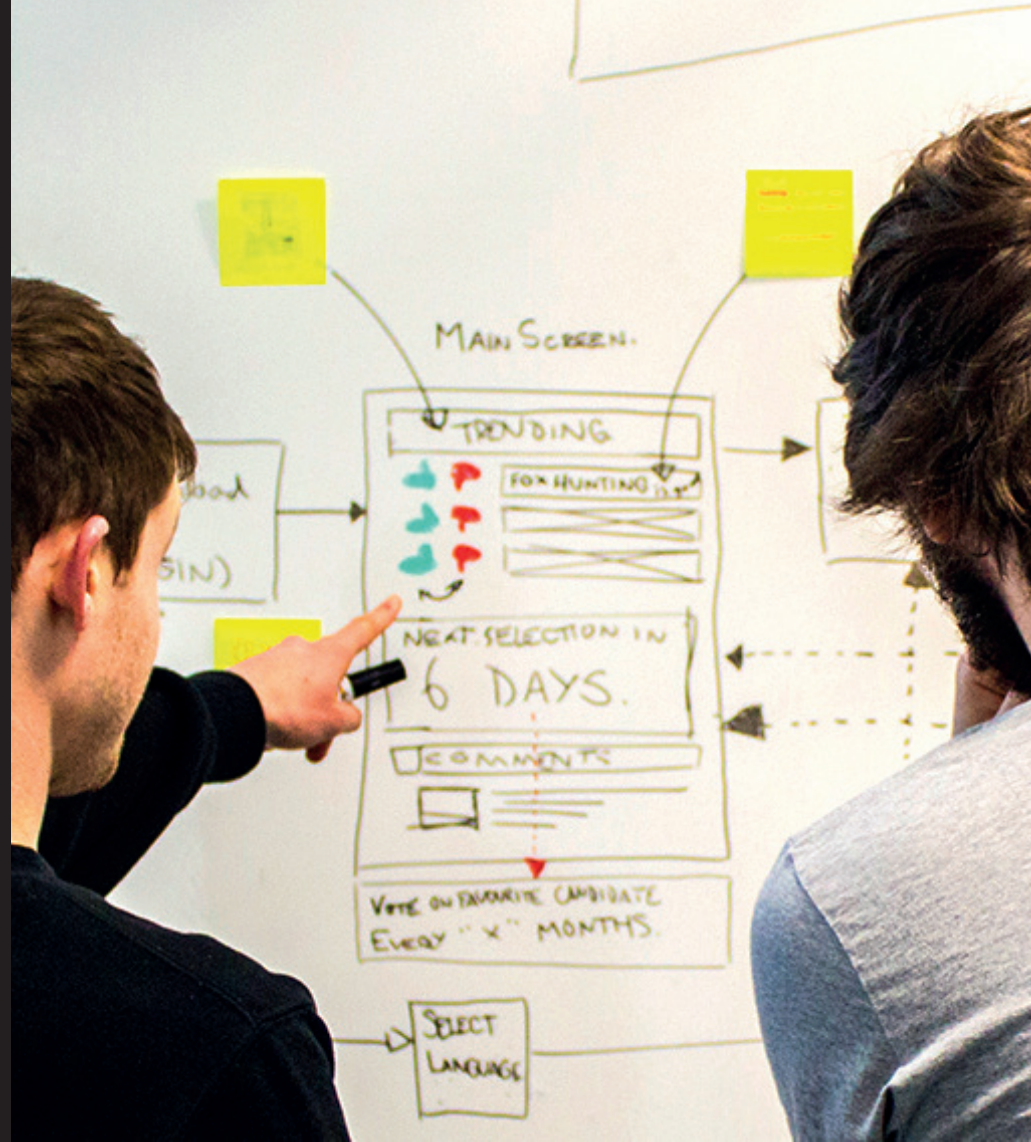

Learning in partnership

Having strong partnerships is critical to delivering an outstanding learning experience. The fact that our partnerships are based on mutually beneficial relationships is evidenced by the length of our connection with many of our partners. Student Law Office

Northumbria's award-winning Student Law Office (SLO) is run as a full legal advice and representation service like any firm of solicitors – providing a vital service for individuals and businesses, many of whom might otherwise be unable to afford legal representation. Students who undertake work in the SLO are divided into firms, which are headed by a supervising member of staff. Students are responsible for progressing real cases and learn interview and communication skills through regular practice. Softer skills, such as building rapport and gaining clients' trust, are difficult to teach in a classroom or role-play scenario. The SLO provides an ideal forum in which these attributes can be developed at an early stage in a lawyer's career.

Northumbria University received the Queen's Anniversary Prize for Higher and Further Education for the outstanding community work of its Student Law Office.

International Students

Scholarships are awarded as a fee discount for full time taught on campus courses. Discounts are dependent on the grades of your highest previous academic qualifications. There is no separate application process; details of any scholarships awarded to you will be detailed in the offer letter. Alumni Discounts (applicable to Home/EU and International students)

If you are a graduate of Northumbria University - or expect to graduate this summer - you will automatically receive a 20% discount on the annual tuition fees off most postgraduate courses.

If you are offered a place at Northumbria, and you are waiting for results of examinations, you must send a copy of these into the Admissions Office as soon as you receive them. In addition to academic

requirements, there may be non-academic conditions attached to your course, such as a suitable Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) Enhanced Certificate, meeting suitability requirements for professional bodies and medical clearance.
