In order to ensure that you are offered the best possible start to your academic studies, and the wider student experience, the Faculty has developed a formal induction that you are expected to attend. The formal induction sessions will take place during the period 8th – 12th January 2018. Please keep the whole week free for university and programme activities.

Please find below some important information regarding your enrolment and induction.

Arrival

You should aim to arrive in Newcastle from **Saturday 6th January 2018**. Northumbria University offers all new international students travelling from abroad a *Meet & Greet* service, providing a free pick-up from Newcastle International Airport to your accommodation. In order to take advantage of this service **you must book** *Meet & Greet* at least 3 working days in advance of **your arrival**, giving your full name and full details of your arrival date, arrival time at Newcastle Airport, flight number, accommodation and course. Online Self-Registration and Enrolment (International Students)

If you have not yet done so, you will need to complete self-registration online **before you arrive** at University. Click <u>here</u> to get started; you will need your University computer username and password, which have been emailed to you previously. When you arrive at Northumbria, you must attend an enrolment session to complete your enrolment process. Enrolment sessions will be taking place as follows:

• Monday 8th January 2018 11.30 – 13.00

and

• Friday 12th January 2018 10.00 – 12.00

The sessions will take place in **Student Central Commons** within the Library building.

You can attend at any time during these opening hours and you must bring your passport and visa with you. You will also receive your student Smartcard when you attend the session and complete your enrolment.

Please note that the final deadline for enrolment is 29th January 2018 for Undergraduate programmes and 5th February 2018 for Postgraduate programmes, after this date you will not be permitted to join the programme.

Induction Schedule

Your induction programme will start on **Monday 8th January 2018** with introductory briefings about the Faculty, Department, and your programme of study at Northumbria. The schedule will also allow you to meet the academic staff and fellow students from your Department. Please note that it is essential that you attend all induction activities to ensure familiarisation with the University and the Programme and to help you to prepare for the academic and social aspects of university life. If you are enrolling on a programme that requires you to complete a pre-course brief, or you need to refer to an equipment or reading list, these will be accessible on-line alongside your induction schedule.

Please note that the induction schedule may be subject to change. Therefore, we strongly recommend that you check the website for updates closer to your time of arrival.

Visas

Most students coming to study on a full-time programme at Northumbria will require a Tier 4 (General) Student Visa. If you already hold a Tier 4 (General) Student Visa, which was issued by another UK higher education institution, you will not be able to enrol with us until you have made an application for a new Tier 4 (General) Student Visa, which bears the Northumbria Sponsor licence number on it.
