STUDENTS TO BENEFIT FURTHER FROM SANTANDER UNIVERSITIES PARTNERSHIP



FREE OFFICE SPACE FOR BUSINESS OWNERS IN THE HATCHERY

Santander is to provide nearly £100,000 of funding in 2017 to support Northumbria students, alumni and staff with new learning and employability opportunities.

Funding will be used to support a number of projects including creating internship opportunities for students and alumni; providing international exchange and mobility opportunities for both students and staff; and creating international travel opportunities for disadvantaged students in order to broaden horizons.

The partnership is now in its second year and has already benefited a wide range of students and staff, with Santander recent opening a bank on campus to provide services to students, staff and the wider community.

Northumbria is also to host for the first time the northern final of the Santander Universities Entrepreneurship Awards as one of only three partner universities from across the UK to be chosen.

This is an annual business pitching competition aimed at giving a financial boost to student and graduate business ventures in their early stages and all eligible partner universities can attend with the opportunity to win cash prizes, mentoring and start-up support. The University's <u>Student and Graduate</u> <u>Enterprise</u> (SGE) service provides free start-up support for Northumbria graduates (up to 5 years) who want to start their own business, be self-employed or grow an existing business of their own*.

SGE can provide free support to graduates at every stage of the business from idea to launch through to scaling up. The unique service is based on bespoke mentoring and free office space on campus.* Specialist industry mentors in areas such as marketing, finance and legal work with you on a one to one basis to ensure advice given is tailored to your business needs. This can include tangible outcomes such as a set of terms and conditions for your website or a contract for your clients, not just advice.

The bespoke mentoring service is complemented with the opportunity to apply for free office space on campus in Newcastle city centre*. The Hatchery houses a number of graduate start-up businesses providing a positive and supportive environment. Start-ups based in The Hatchery can take advantage of free facilities such as ICT, broadband, dedicated telephone and access to meeting rooms. WORLD AUTHORITIES ON ENGINEERING AND BUSINESS RECEIVE HONORARY DEGREES



NORTHUMBRIA INVITES EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST IN LEVERHULME EARLY CAREER FELLOWSHIPS

Leading figures who have made an impact in the world of business and engineering were recognised at Northumbria University during the Winter Congregation Ceremonies.

Professor Dame Ann Dowling, the first female President of the Royal Academy of Engineering, and Dr W.A. Wijewardena, the former Deputy Governor of the Central Bank of Sri Lanka, will both received honorary doctorates during Northumbria's December graduation ceremonies.

The recipients of honorary degrees are nominated by the University's staff for their achievements, their links to the University - and for their sheer inspirational qualities. Northumbria University will support a number of applications to the Leverhulme Trust's Early Career Fellowships (ECF) scheme in the 2017 competition.

The scheme offers funding for outstanding early-career researchers who have not held a full-time permanent post in a UK university. Fellowships are funded for three years and offer research expenses of up to £6,000 per year.

We are inviting expressions of interest from earlycareer researchers interested in collaborating with us on our Multidisciplinary Research Themes. Northumbria University offers a stimulating research environment and was ranked highly in REF 2014.

NORTHUMBRIA UNIVERSITY TO EXPAND DEGREE APRENTICESHIP PROVISION



THE FUTURE OF ARCHITECTURE IS IN SAFE HANDS AT NORTHUMBRIA

Northumbria University has announced a major £240,000 investment to expand its degree apprenticeships into the architecture, surveying and construction, digital and leadership and management sectors.

The University has successfully secured £140,000 from the Higher Education Funding Council for England (HEFCE) to expand its existing workbased learning provision.

Northumbria was one of the first universities in the UK to offer government-supported degree apprenticeships. These specialist courses are codesigned with employers to ensure they are providing the skills that industry is looking for.

Students enrolled on degree apprenticeships are employed and divide their time between the workplace and flexible university study. To find out more about how your business could benefit click 'read more' below.

A Northumbria University student has won first prize at a national award ceremony for his inclusive and mature architectural design.

Masters of Architecture student Simon Ward was presented with the £2,000 National Student Designer Award at the Association for Project Safety (APS) National Awards in London in recognition of his work. The awards are intended to encourage continuous improvement in design and recognise excellence in Design and Construction Risk Management with Design professions.

The brief asked students to outline how their design project contributed to reducing and managing risks in the preservation and eventual deconstruction of the building. Students were also challenged to consider pioneering ways in which the risks could be reduced or managed if they could not be eradicated.

LIGHTING THE FUSE FOR CREATIVE TALENT IN THE NORTH EAST

PARTNERSHIP BRINGS EUROPE'S TOP **BASKETBALL PLAYERS TO NORTHUMBRIA**

A £4m project which will unlock the potential of the North East's creative, digital and IT (CDIT) sector was officially launched on Thursday 1 December 2016.

Creative Fuse North East is a unique partnership between the region's five universities Northumbria, Newcastle, Durham, Sunderland and Teesside. Specialist academics and staff will work with industry, cultural organisations, charities and the public sector to explore how CDIT firms complement and add value to each other, sharing best practice and encouraging the adoption of new innovative working practices. This will ensure the sector becomes more resilient and grows faster - creating more and better jobs for the region.

The project, which is led by Newcastle University, was launched by former Minister of State for Culture and the Digital Economy, the Right Hon Ed Vaizey MP, who has been appointed Chairman of the Creative Fuse North East Advisory Board.

Up to 80 professional basketball players from all corners of Europe will be coming to Northumbria University, Newcastle, next summer to help build a career beyond their playing days.

On the 8 July, both male and female players representing every European country will spend an intensive week of learning at Northumbria's Newcastle Business School, which will culminate in a Leadership and Management degree from the University.

Time-Out is the first project of its kind that is designed exclusively for basketball players and has secured considerable funding from the European Union Erasmus+ Programme. Northumbria was chosen by the International Basketball Federation (FIBA) Europe because of its international reputation for pioneering learning and academic excellence and in 2015 it was named UK Business School of the Year in The Times Higher Education Awards.

The 'Six Times Open' campaign launched on Friday 18 November at the National Gallery in London, numerous events and activities are planned to take place throughout the calendar year, both around the UK and internationally with support from many partners such as the NHS, British Airways and Ross Edgley.

Brothers, Jonathan and David are passionate about encouraging people to be as positive as they can be about living with heart disease, stating that "events such as this don't have to define who you are or dictate your life".

NORTHUMBRIA TO DEVISE NEW GLOBAL ECO-INNOVATION SYSTEM FOR NORTH EAST

Northumbria University, Newcastle, is collaborating with one of the world's top universities to devise a new global eco-innovation system for the North East.

The partnership with Tsinghua University, based in Beijing, and start-up funding provider Cocoon Networks, was initiated by Professor Yu Xiong of Northumbria' Newcastle Business School.

It was announced as part of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signing agreement between Tsinghua University Science Park Group (TusPark Group) and Newcastle City Council to help forge closer ties between the North East and China.

Founded in 1911, Tsinghua University consistently tops a range of international higher education rankings, the latest US News world rank put it as No. 1 globally for engineering.
